A tenure-track investigator position is available in the HIV-Drug Resistance Program (HIV DRP), Center for Cancer Research (CCR), National Cancer Institute (NCI), National Institutes of Health (NIH) Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS). The HIV DRP, CCR, NCI, is searching for a tenure-track investigator engaged in patient-based research of HIV infection. The research program will be in an area of patient oriented investigations that complements the existing focus of the DRP on the pathogenesis, prevention, or treatment of AIDS. The Clinical Branch is located on the Bethesda campus of the NIH and interacts closely with the basic research program and virology core components of the DRP on the NCI-Frederick campus in Frederick, MD. Current areas of research include the origin and consequences of HIV genetic diversity, evolution of drug resistance, persistence of infection despite effective therapy, and related topics. Candidates for the position should have an M.D./Ph.D. or M.D.; ABIM certification in Internal Medicine and Infectious Diseases; a minimum of five years of postdoctoral experience in HIV/AIDS research, strong clinical and research credentials, and an in-depth understanding of regulatory and ethical aspects of human research. Applicant will direct a research group of postdoctoral fellows and technicians funded by the NCI intramural program and will be provided sufficient space, equipment, and supply budget. Salary is competitive and commensurate with experience and accomplishments and a full Civil Service package of benefits is available (including retirement, health insurance, life insurance, and a Thrift Savings Plan).
