Assistant Professor, Biology

Shared position at Pennocks Bridge & Downingtown campuses in Chester County. Master's degree required, Doctorate preferred, in one of the Biological Sciences, to include coursework related to human anatomy and physiology, and college-level teaching experience, preferably including human anatomy and physiology. Although a background that will enable the applicant to teach all general biology courses is required, specifically seeking applicants with a strong background, demonstrated ability, and a genuine desire to teach Human Anatomy and Physiology. The specific teaching assignment will be based upon the needs of the students and the division, and may include evening and weekend courses (see course descriptions at www.dccc.edu). Other responsibilities include assisting in course development and improvement, advising students, meeting scheduled office hours, and regular participation in discipline, division, & college meetings and committees. Faculty are expected to be committed to academic excellence and continuous improvement, working collaboratively & effectively with others (faculty, staff, & administrators), support & contribute to diversity and student success initiatives, and remain current in their subject area & teaching methodologies. The applicant must be committed to the community college philosophy, and be able to demonstrate excellent teaching skills (a teaching demonstration is part of the interview process) and show evidence of being more committed to teaching than to research. The applicant also must have the ability to employ a variety of teaching methods and be familiar with alternative learning styles, classroom technologies, and course management systems.
