The laboratory of “Molecular Infectiology” at the Institute of Medical Microbiology, Immunology and Hygiene of the University Cologne is inviting applications for a PhD-student Position. We are seeking highly motivated scientists to develop and execute research projects on gene regulation of immune response to microbial pathogens.

These research positions are funded for 2 years, starting immediately, with the possibility of extension for another 3 years according to the German TV-L E13 salary scaling system in the laboratory of Dr Nikoletta Papadopoulou.

Applicants with a strong background in molecular immunology, with an emphasis on gene regulation by RNAi and signal transduction, who are interested in working in a newly established independent junior group associated with the SFB 670 collaborative project in Cell Autonomous Immunity (www.sfb670.uni-koeln.de) are particularly welcome to apply. Previous practical experience on infectiology and microRNAs would be an asset.

Female scientists are particularly encouraged to apply and will be preferentially considered if suitably qualified.

We also welcome applications from disabled candidates, who also will be preferentially considered if suitably qualified.
